

Art design Workshop, Week 5

Project title: Abstract Art using an assortment of brushes and filters

Students should open a new file (Ctrl+n) and use preset sizes 640x480

Abstract art is generally understood to mean art that does not depict objects in the natural world, but instead uses color and form in a non-representational way.

Examples of abstract art by assorted modern artists:



Students should take their time to create their own unique abstract art using several different styles of brushes (I'd say, at least 8 completely different brush varieties), assorted colors of their choice and a variety of filters.

Filters are located at the top toolbar under "Filter".

Filters are neat effects that change the appearance of designs.

Students should explore all the filters and then experiment with different ones for their final abstract piece.

When art is completed, students should print them landscape style.

Go to File > Print with Preview > Page setup > Landscape > OK > Print > Print.

If these print correctly, the student does not need to save the art.

Like all other art prints, they should be put in a transparent sheet, and in portfolio. Then students should go to Microsoft Office Word and type up the title of today's project (at the top of this sheet) and answer two things:

- **What design technique was learned today**
- **How the technique was used**

**..... followed by their name and the day's date.
This gets printed and put in back of the art.**
